COVENANTS

Aloha Everyone! As you all might have recently noticed by our recent near-misses, we are currently in the middle of Hurricane Season. The Pacific Hurricane Season is defined as June 1st through November 30th. A hurricane is a major disaster, so it is essential that people need to do some preparation before the storm occurs. Below are some things to think about:

STORAGE

Make necessary arrangements to remove all storage to prevent accidents. Please refer to the DCC&R Section 5.02 (o).

TREES AND LANDSCAPING

Evaluate your trees and landscaped areas. Prune/cut any trees that are a safety hazard or could cause damage to the area. Please refer to the DCC&R Section 5.02 (d).

We encourage everyone to have a Hurricane Plan and be aware of your surroundings. There is a lot you can do around your home to help protect it. Be sure to follow all instructions from the local authority regarding evacuation and other safety procedures. Be safe!

BULKY ITEM PICKUP

The monthly scheduled bulk pick-up for the villages is the first Monday of every month. Items cannot be placed out until the evening before pick-up. All bulk items should

be placed neatly at curbside fronting your home and not on the corners of a street. Your Green Waste container should be used for all tree cutting and grass clippings. All boxes and recyclable items should be placed in your Recycle blue bin and not at curbside for bulky pick-up. The City will not pick-up tires and/or hazardous waste from curbside. If you missed that pick up, you may dispose of your bulky items at the Ewa Convenience Center on Geiger Road, from 7 a.m. – 6 p.m. daily. Please visit the City's website at www.opala.org on what items can be placed at curbside for pick-up.

STREET SWEEPING

Street sweeping will be scheduled on a monthly basis. Please look out for signs that will be posted in the medians notifying residents of scheduled dates.

KEKUILANI LIGHT POLES

We are currently having all the light poles belonging to the Villages of Kapolei painted in the Kekuilani area. Please notify the Association if the light pole in your area is not in operating condition. You can contact the Association at (808) 674-4444.

PAINTING

The Covenants Department will be going through the Villages and begin to send out Painting Letters to those residents in need of

house painting, fence painting, or mailbox painting. If you receive a letter from the Covenants Department, please come to the office to pick up your paint color codes. Color codes will not be given over the phone.

PARKING

Streets within the Villages continue to be congested with vehicles. As a reminder, any vehicles that are parked on the front lawn at any time, day or night, will be automatically assessed a \$150.00 fine. Please refer to the DCC&R Section 5.02 (r).

Update from State Senator Mike Gabbard

TOUR OF UH WEST O’AHU ALLIED HEALTH/ADMINISTRATIVE BUILDING

I went on a tour of the UHWO Allied Health Building on August 31st. A Groundbreaking Ceremony for the facility was held in 2016. The building will house programs such as allied health, community health, health information management, long term care, and biology. The 43,000-sq. ft. building will contain administrative offices, faculty offices, classrooms, and lab spaces. The building is scheduled to open on October 27 for administration and in the spring 2019 for students.

NATIONAL DRIVE ELECTRIC WEEK

I participated in an interview for Hawai’i News Now’s Lifestyle Program for National Drive Electric Week at HECO’s Fast Electric Charging Station at Kapolei Commons on August 27. I served as the Chair of the Senate’s Energy and Environment Committee from 2009 to 2015. During this time, we were ramping up our efforts to switch to a clean energy economy. So in April 2011, I purchased an all-electric Nissan Leaf because I thought it made sense for the ENE Chair to “walk the talk.” Just a year later in 2012, there were 751 electric vehicles in our state. However, I’m pleased to say that we continue to make progress and as of July 2018, there are 7,497 EVs and close to 600 EV charging stations across the state. And, BTW, my Leaf has 80K miles and runs like a charm. Though if my kids bought me a Tesla Model X, or even better a Porsche Taycan, I’d gladly add their names back to my last will and testament. Just sayin’!

BE A MEALS ON WHEELS VOLUNTEER

Hawai’i Meals on Wheels delivers hot meals to homebound kupuna and the disabled. Last year, they delivered 88,000 meals across O’ahu. At the August Ewa Neighborhood Board meeting, representatives from Meals on Wheels made a presentation on the need to recruit volunteers in our community to make

NEW AFFORDABLE HOUSING RENTAL IN EAST KAPOLEI

On July 30, 2018, I had the honor of attending the groundbreaking for Keahumoa Place in East Kapolei. Located off of Keahumoa Parkway near the Kroc Center, this four-phase, multi-family apartment rental will provide families making 30%, 60%, and 100% of the area median income with an opportunity to rent in our beautiful community of Kapolei. At the ceremony, I had the privilege of speaking about the importance of public-private partnerships and how the Michaels Organization, in partnership with the State’s Hawaii Housing Finance & Development Corporation, worked together to make this 100% affordable rental project a reality. The anticipated date of completion for Phase I is May 2019. UHWO ACADEMY OF CREATIVE MEDIA

Many people have asked me what the next phase of construction occurring on the University of Hawaii at West Oahu campus will be. As you may recall, I helped secure nearly \$40M for the planning and construction of a new creative media center at UHWO as I have been an ardent supporter of digital and creative media. I am pleased to report additional details regarding the timeline of this project. The design phase of the Creative Media building is expected to end this year, with construction to start in January 2019. The building’s design will include four editing suites and a media lab for advanced media/technology production. These new facilities will bring the film industry to Hawaii

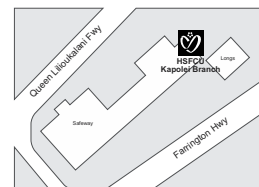

BULLETIN BOARD

I.D. CARDS

Owner's wishing to use the recreation center facilities, programs, and services are required to have a Villages of Kapolei Association I.D. card. The cost starts at \$5 per card, per person, and is good for one year. Owners should bring a photo I.D. card. If you are obtaining a card for any child between the ages of 7 to 17 for the first time, please also bring the child's birth certificate. Absentee owners who rent out their homes should complete a Transfer of Privilege form before their renters come in for an I.D. card. Other restrictions may apply. For members in good standing.

PAYING BY CHECK OR CREDIT CARD

Check payments to the Association must be made payable to "Villages of Kapolei." Abbreviations such as "VOK," "VOKA," or "Kapolei Rec," etc., are common to other businesses and will not be accepted. All check payments will be processed electronically as an ACH transaction. The Association accepts most credit/debit cards for payment.

FAX SERVICES

Residents of the Villages of Kapolei are welcome to use the Association's fax machine for outgoing faxes only. All faxes to local numbers are free. Long distance faxes are accepted for a nominal fee (starting at 25 cents). Just show us your VOK membership card. Faxes to international numbers are not accepted. For members in good standing.

LOST & FOUND

Are you missing keys, a wallet, ID cards, a bicycle or scooter? The Villages of Kapolei has a growing supply of lost & found items. Come by the Association office if you've lost anything in this vicinity. Lost ID cards, clothing and towels, may also be in the Lost and Found at the swimming pool.

NOTARY SERVICES

Free notary services are available for members in good standing. Please call 674-4444 for an appointment.

REQUEST POTHOLE SERVICE ONLINE

See a pothole? Visit the city's pothole repair information page online at their website www1.honolulu.gov/dfm/road/pothole.htm. There are phone numbers to call for both city roads and state roads to report potholes, or, you can fill out a simple form online to request service on a city street.

REPORT ABANDONED VEHICLES ONLINE

The city has a simple online form to report abandoned or derelict vehicles at www3.honolulu.gov/csdavcomplaints. An abandoned vehicle is a vehicle parked on public roadways that has not been attended to

for more than 24 hours. A derelict vehicle is a vehicle parked on public roadways that is missing major components that render it inoperable.

PARK CLOSURES

Association owned parks and open green spaces are closed between the hours of 10:00 p.m. to 5:00 a.m. These areas are located in the Villages of Malanai, Aeloa, Kekuilani, and Iwalani as well as the areas surrounding the recreation center.

EMAIL BLAST

To get email updates on new recreation programs and special events, submit your name, phone number, and email to recreation@villagesofkapolei.com, or, come by the recreation office to sign up, right next door at your Association office.

DUST PROBLEMS

According to the Department of Health Clean Air Branch, complaints and concerns about dust problems created by area operations or new construction should be directed to the Clean Air Branch at 586-4200. Be prepared with specifics such as date, time, location, and conditions. Your concerns will be forwarded to an inspector for follow up.

COPY SERVICES

The most convenient place for copy services is right next door at your Association office. Members in good standing can receive up to ten free copies. Additional copies are only \$.10 cents each. (Please note copyrighted items such as sheet music or patterns may not be copied.) Just show us your VOK membership card. Other restrictions may apply.

LOW FLYING AIRCRAFT

Safety complaints about low flying aircraft can be directed to the Airport Suggestion Hotline at (888) 697-7813, to be forwarded to the FAA. Be prepared to provide details about the incident such as date, time, type of aircraft, direction, color and markings.

Halloween Safety Tips



Halloween is a great time for children to play pretend, enjoy treats, and socialize in the neighborhood. However, roaming around in the dark can present risks. According to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, these common tips will keep your keiki safe on Halloween:

Swords, knives, and other costume accessories should be short, soft, and flexible.

Fasten reflective tape to costumes and bags to help drivers see you.

Only walk on sidewalks whenever possible, or on the far edge of the road facing traffic to stay safe.

Look both ways before crossing the street.

Use crosswalks wherever possible.

Avoid trick-or-treating alone. Walk in groups or with a trusted adult.

Enter homes only if you're with a trusted adult. Only visit well-lit houses. Never accept rides from strangers.

Examine all treats for choking hazards and tampering before eating them. Limit the amount of treats you eat.

Hold a flashlight while trick-or-treating to help you see and others see you. WALK and don't run from house to house.

Always test make-up in a small area first. Remove it before bedtime to prevent possible skin and eye irritation.

Lower your risk for serious eye injury by not wearing decorative contact lenses.

Wear well-fitting masks, costumes, and shoes to avoid blocked vision, trips, and falls.

Eat only factory-wrapped treats. Avoid eating homemade treats made by strangers.

Never walk near lit candles or luminaries. Be sure to wear flame-resistant costumes.

Temporary Holiday Decorations are exempted and you do not need to receive approval from the VOK Association to put them up around your home. All holiday decorations are permitted to be installed no sooner than thirty (30) days prior to the holiday and must be removed no later than fifteen (15) days after the holiday.

• All Halloween Decorations may be put up beginning October 1, 2018, and must be removed by November 15, 2018.

• All Christmas Decorations may be put up beginning November 15, 2018, and must be removed by January 15, 2019.
