



As we enter this new year, what better way to start than to clean, clean, clean! Here at Villages of Kapolei, we take pride in having our Community looking pleasant and beautiful. We all share the responsibility in making sure certain standards are met. Below are a few things we as a Community can work together on in keeping Kapolei looking great!

TRASH PICK UP POLICY

Collection service in our neighborhood is conducted twice per week by the City and County of Honolulu Refuse Department. The Villages of Kapolei Association does **NOT** conduct refuse or bulky pick up. The scheduled dates for pick up are Wednesday and Saturday. One day is designated for refuse pick up and the other for recycling/green waste. The Green Waste container should be used for all tree cutting and grass clippings. All boxes and recyclable items should be placed in your Recycle blue bin and not at curbside for bulky pick-up. Most island homes are using the wheeled carts that are provided by the City, but some areas where automated collection is not possible, are still serviced with a manual collection system using your own 35- gallon containers. If you are located in a manual collection area, both of your weekly collection days are mixed waste, no sorting as yet. Recycling was expanded to the automated areas first, and plans for the manual areas are currently underway. All areas have monthly collection of bulky items, including multi- family, residential apartment buildings.

Per the Villages of Kapolei Association DCC&R Section 5.02 (n): No Owner shall keep garbage or trash on any lot so as to be visible from a neighboring lot, except in closed receptacles screened from view from any adjoining street, and no accumulated waste plant materials will be permitted on any lot, except as part of an established compost pile maintained in such a manner as not to be visible from a neighboring lot.

Trash receptacles may be placed out the night prior to scheduled pick up dates and returned back to their designated areas not visible from the street.

BULKY PICK UP POLICY

Kapolei's streets and sidewalks can be clutter- free and safe, and we believe this will significantly reduce illegal dumping. But only if you do your part as well. Everyone must responsibly adhere to the schedule

and place items at the curb only on their designated days. As a reminder, Villages of Kapolei does **NOT** conduct bulky items pick-up.

It is illegal to place items at the curb on any days other than the specified collection day or area(s) other than fronting your property. **Property owners are subject to fines** up to \$250 per offense; individuals are subject to fines up to \$2,500 per offense. Your cooperation will prevent penalties and help keep the neighborhood clean and safe.

The monthly scheduled bulk pick-up for the villages is the **FIRST MONDAY OF EVERY MONTH**. Items **CANNOT** be placed out until the evening before pick-up. All bulk items should be placed neatly at curbside fronting your home and not on the corners of a street or fire hydrants. Here is a list of acceptable items to place curbside:

Furniture, mattresses, bed frames and box springs, rolled up and fastened carpeting, appliances, minor home repairs/remodeling materials not to exceed one cubic yard.

Unacceptable items for pickup would be: Construction materials such as tile and drywall, demolition debris, dirt, rock, concrete, large automobile parts, or hazardous waste.

If you are unable to make that pick up, you may dispose of your bulky items at the Ewa Convenience Center on Geiger Road, from 7am-6pm daily. **Should you have any questions, you may visit the City's website at www.opala.org or call them at 808-768-3200.**

If you witness someone illegally dumping items on your property, call 911 immediately and file a police report. This is our neighborhood, our island, and our responsibility to care for its health and beauty.
